# Our Response to the Gang Violence in 2016 Operation Safe Streets




- Working closely with CFSEU and with IHIT





### Crime Rates in Fraser Valley and Metro Vancouver






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## Overall Crime Rate for Abbotsford 2005 - 2015





## Violent Crime Rate for Abbotsford 2005 - 2015








# Violent Crime Rate for 2015 per 100,000 population





# Property Crime Rate for 2015 per 100,000 population






# YTD 2016 Property Crime Rate per 100,000 population



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# YTD 2016 Theft of Auto Crime Rate per 100,000 population









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#### APD - Population to Police Ratio 2008 - 2017



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




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## Agency Comparison - 2014 COST PER CAPITA



- 5 new positions (additional requests)



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
#### **APD % Expenditure Budget Increase**

#### Drivers for Base Increase in 2017



- Estimated APU/Teamster increases
- Integrated units (IHIT/FVIDS)
- > PRIME, E-Comm, Legal fees
- > DNA Analysis
- Loss in revenue (Provincial grant area H/court forfeiture)
- Partly offset by reductions in: Uniform replacements and fuel & oil

### 2017 Budget Additional Requests – 1.53%



- > 5 additional positions:
  - 4 Police Officers
  - Return to Work Coordinator
- > CCTV Storage

### 2017 Budget Additional Requests – 1.53%



- > 4 Police Officers:
  - Demand for reactive policing increasing
    - Surge in property crime, gang violence.
    - Priority calls increasing steadily
    - Mental Health and Missing Person Calls increasing
  - Proactive policing suffering resources diverted from proactive functions
  - Returns authorized strength to 2014 level

### 2017 Budget Additional Requests – 1.53%



- > Return to Work Coordinator
  - Address health and wellness issues
  - Reduce time away from work, improve productivity
  - Increase fully-deployable strength
- CCTV Storage
  - Replace system nearing end-of-life
  - In 2018, we will have doubled the capacity of digital evidence from 1 year to 2

(\$135,000 in 2017; \$50,000 in 2018)

### Tax Impact of Budget Increase



Total Budget Increase	\$ 2.035M
Less: New taxes from development (growth)	<u>0.708M</u>
Tax Increase Required	1.327M

Tax Revenue Available before Increase	\$45.851M
% Increase in Tax Revenue Required (1.327/45.851)	2.89%
Impact on a Tax Notice (1.327/127.3)	1.04%



### Potential Challenges

New IHIT funding formula still undecided, however it will be phased in



- DNA analysis costs downloaded from the Province; APD's estimated share is \$90k
- ➤ APU & Teamsters contracts ended

  December 2015 actual increases unknown
- > \$386k transfer from operating reserve to fund 2017 (plus \$328K in 2016)
