

FUTURE OF FOOD BANKS


INTRODUCTION

- Archway Food Bank works to create consistent access to food for everyone. This is done by reducing barriers to access, collaborating with community partners and championed by volunteers, donors and staff.
- Over 5,000 unique individuals are accessing supplemental food at no cost through Archway's Food Bank programming each month. Over 9,000 individuals accessed food through the Food Bank throughout 2023. That's a 74% increase since 2021



FOOD AND FUNDING

Grants from Food Banks Canada and Food Banks BC make up roughly 7% of Archway Food Bank's current revenue.





WHAT DOES BEING A REGISTERED FOOD BANK MEAN?

Food Banks BC allows for one registered food bank per city.

Archway Food Bank is Abbotsford's only representative and member in good standing with Food Banks BC and Food Bank's Canada.

With this membership association comes governance, food safety guidelines, advocacy, funding and partnerships.

FOOD RECOVERY

The highest level of risk are practices that include:

- Breaking down and repacking allergen-containing foods
- Meats and or potentially hazardous foods
- Washing, rinsing or repacking fresh fruits or vegetables
- Practice "gleaning"
- Conduct processing activities (eg. Cooking, meal preparation)
- Grow own fruits and vegetables
- Accepting community garden produce
