

History of ACT

- Shift from in-patient model to community model
- Focused on bringing services to the person/community
- Implemented worldwide
- First Fraser Health ACT Team: Surrey
- BC: 34 teams
- FHA: 7 teams



Core Values and Goals

- Person-centred and trauma informed
- Housing First model
- Harm Reduction focused
- Psychosocial Rehabilitation
- Reduce frequency of hospital and police presentations
- Wrap around services
- Emphasis on building relationships



Service Delivery

- Team-based care
- Shared caseload
- Outreach based service
- Continuity of care
- Intensive supports and engagement strategies
- Extended hours



Service Delivery

- Focused on goals, skills training and connection
- Services are tailored for the person
- Improve functioning
- Symptom management
- Long-term treatment approach



Eligibility

Enhanced ACT (Langley, Abbotsford/Mission, Maple Ridge, New West/Tri-Cities)

- Is an adult (over 19+)
- Calls Langley/Abbotsford/Mission/Maple Ridge/New West or Tri-Cities home
- Ongoing history of being at risk of or currently homeless or precariously housed
- Complex and significant mental health and/or substance use challenges that severely impact functioning
- Has not been able to have needs met by other agencies
- Requires individualized community based supports to meet wellness goals



Locations

- Abbotsford/Mission
- Maple Ridge
- Langley
- Surrey
- Surrey/Delta
- New Westminster/Tri-Cities
- Burnaby





Eligibility

Traditional ACT (All except Langley)

- Severe/persistent mental illness that seriously impairs function
- Inability to perform ADLS or maintain employment/maintain home or safe living situation
- High use of services
- Sever symptoms or coexisting substance use disorder or coexisting development disability or inability to consistently meet basic needs or able to transition to independent living with ACT supports or difficulty utilizing traditional office-based services

Length of Treatment

- Indefinite service delivery
- Treatment intensity varies based on needs
- Engagement is not dependent on services received
- Recognize that needs vary over time
- Slow transitions to stepdown services when appropriate



Referral Process

- Fax referral
- Assessment & Collateral
- Referral Screening Meeting
- Outcome: Acceptance or Recommendations
- Transition of care
