





### Age Distribution





### Rented Dwellings





Since 2016, household incomes have risen by approximately 17%.






Since 2016, individual incomes have lowered by approximately 20%.


#### Total low-income residents (after tax)






#### Education



### **Ethnicity**




40.2% of Abbotsford residents are of a visible minority group.
