




Family Structure



Age Distribution






In 2016, 20.1% of owner households were spending 30% or more of their income on (unaffordable) shelter costs. In 2021, the percentage of people with unnaffordable payments lowered to 19.9%.

Rented Dwellings


Average monthly rent






Income

Since 2016, household incomes have risen by approximately 11%.




Median Individual Income


Total low-income residents (after tax)




A household is considered "low income" if its total after-tax income is 50% of the median for households in Canada, adjusted for size.




