




Family Structure



Age Distribution





In 2016, 19% of owner households were spending 30% or more of their income on (unaffordable) shelter costs. In 2021, the percentage of people with unnaffordable payments lowered to 20%.

Rented Dwellings


Average monthly rent



Since 2016, household incomes have risen by approximately 31%.








Total low-income residents (after tax)






Education




