



# Age Distribution





### Rent/Own

In Canada, housing is considered unaffordable if it costs more than 30% of a household's before-tax income.

### **Owned Dwellings**


Average monthly payments 2016: \$1,491 2021: \$1,650

In 2016, 17.2% of owner households were spending 30% or more of their income on (unaffordable) shelter costs. In 2021, the percentage of people with unnaffordable payments lowered to 9.2%.

### **Rented Dwellings**

Average monthly rent 2016: \$1,128 2021: \$1,440

In 2016, 34% of tenant households were spending 30% or more of their income on (unaffordable) shelter costs. In 2021, the percentage of people with unnaffordable rent rose to 19.6%.



Since 2016, household incomes have risen by approximately 27%.




### Median Individual Income

### Total low-income residents (after tax)




## Low-Income definition


A household is considered "low income" if its total after-tax income is 50% of the median for households in Canada, adjusted for size.






22.6% of Sumas Prairie residents are of a visible minority group.
