City Wide Burn Ban in Effect June 1

ABBOTSFORD, BC: May 30, 2018– A City wide burning ban is currently in effect until September 30, 2018.

Burning permit applications are no longer being accepted for this season. Residents are reminded that burning during the burn ban is a ticketed offence and warnings will not be issued to those found burning in the City of Abbotsford.

The City of Abbotsford reminds all residents to respect the burn ban in place as we are entering the warm dry summer months where chances of wildfires increases.

Open air burning is NOT permitted in URBAN areas at any time of the year. Urban residents are reminded that open-air burning is not permitted in urban areas at any time of the year. This includes the use of outdoor fireplaces and portable wood-burning appliances. Residents who wish to enjoy campfires in urban areas should use propane-fuelled devices and operate them safely according to manufacturer's instructions.
